Approval of Adoption of the Illinois Plumbing Code

Pursuant to Section 36 of the Illinois Plumbing License Law (the “Law”; 225 ILCS 320/36) and Section 750.800(b) of the Illinois Plumbers Licensing Code (the “Code”; 68 Il. Adm. Code 750.800(b)), units of local government should seek Illinois Department of Public Health (“IDPH”) advisement and approval to administer a plumbing program. The review and approval of the following governmental unit ordinance applies solely to the authorized governmental unit for the

City of Zion based upon the governmental unit’s adoption of the Illinois Plumbing Code (77 Il. Adm. Code 890) in its current form, without addition, modification, exception or amendment.

Ordinance No. 15-O-16, Article IX “Plumbing” Section 10-296 “Code Adopted”

“The regulations and standards governing the design, installation, construction, alteration, removal, demolition, equipment, use and occupancy, location and maintenance of the building structures, including permits and penalties which are essential to insure reasonable safeguards to protect the public health and safety against the hazards of inadequate, defective or unsafe plumbing systems and installations as set forth in the most current version of the Illinois State Plumbing Code, as promulgated and published by the State Department of Public Health, with no additions, revisions, exceptions or amendments is adopted in full by the City of Zion and made applicable to all existing or future buildings, structures and premises within the corporate limits of the City...”

The Illinois Department of Public Health hereby approves the governmental unit ordinance, as stated above, and as authorized by the Law and the Code. Pursuant to the Law and the Code, this IDPH Approval of Adoption is legally valid on the Effective Date, as referenced and identified above.

*NOTE: As referenced by Section 42 of the Law, “the power to regulate the licensing of plumbers, to promulgate a minimum plumbing code of standards, and to regulate the registration of irrigation contractors and plumbing contractors shall... be exercised by the Illinois Department of Public Health, and may not be authorized by any unit of local government, including home rule units.” (225 ILCS 320/42)
