



Approval of Adoption of the Illinois Plumbing Code

Pursuant to Section 36 of the Illinois Plumbing License Law (the “Law”; 225 ILCS 320/36) and Section 750.800(b) of the Illinois Plumbers Licensing Code (the “Code”; 68 Il. Adm. Code 750.800(b)), units of local government should seek Illinois Department of Public Health (“IDPH”) advisement and approval to administer a plumbing program. The review and approval of the following governmental unit ordinance applies solely to the authorized governmental unit for the Village of Beach Park based upon the governmental unit’s adoption of the Illinois Plumbing Code (77 Il. Adm. Code 890) in its current form.

Ordinance Number 0615-847-0001 “Any new buildings and buildings undergoing renovation which involve plumbing system changes to areas of the structure below grade level, served by public or private sewer system shall have overhead plumbing. Sanitary wastes that cannot be discharged by gravity flow shall be discharged into a gas tight, covered and vented sump from which the waste shall be listed and discharged into a sanitary waste drain by automatic sewage ejection pumping equipment (see Appendix J Illustration K).” (Amends 890.551 of the ILPC)	06-08-15	06-08-18
