



## Approval of Adoption of the Illinois Plumbing Code

Pursuant to Section 36 of the Illinois Plumbing License Law (the “Law”; 225 ILCS 320/36) and Section 750.800(b) of the Illinois Plumbers Licensing Code (the “Code”; 68 Il. Adm. Code 750.800(b)), units of local government should seek Illinois Department of Public Health (“IDPH”) advisement and approval to administer a plumbing program. The review and approval of the following governmental unit ordinance applies solely to the authorized governmental unit for the Village of Huntley based upon the governmental unit’s adoption of the Illinois Plumbing Code (77 Il. Adm. Code 890) in its current form, without addition, modification, exception or amendment.

#### 150.10 ADOPTION OF THE 2014 ILLINOIS PLUMBING CODE

(A) Adoption: Pursuant to the authority granted by Title 65 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/1-3-2, the Village of Huntley hereby adopts by reference as criteria for the required permits and for the installation, alteration, construction, addition to or depletion from, reconstruction, repair or modification to any plumbing, sewer or combination thereof, systems or components within the jurisdictional boundaries of the Village of Huntley, State of Illinois, Department of Public Health regulations known commonly as the 2014 edition of the State Plumbing Code as published.

The Illinois Department of Public Health hereby approves the governmental unit ordinance, as stated above, and as authorized by the Law and the Code. Pursuant to the Law and the Code, this IDPH Approval of Adoption is legally valid on the Effective Date, as referenced and identified above.

\*NOTE: As referenced by Section 42 of the Law, “the power to regulate the licensing of plumbers, to promulgate a minimum plumbing code of standards, and to regulate the registration of irrigation contractors and plumbing contractors shall... be exercised by the Illinois Department of Public Health, and may not be exercised by any unit of local government, including home rule units.” (225 ILCS 320/42)
